


**Figure 1. Range of Monthly Premiums of Basic Health Insurance in Major Swiss Cities, 2007 (300 CHF; \$255 Deductible)**



Premium Distribution in Major Swiss Cities



**Figure 2. Correlation Between Premium Level and Physician Density/Hospital Bed Density**





### Figure 3. Health Expenditures as a Percentage of GDP, 1980–2006





Figure 4. Per Capita Spending, U.S. Dollar Purchasing Power Parity, 1980–2006





**Figure 5. Funding of Health Expenditures in 2006, Percentage by Source**




