Commonwealth Fund Fellowship in Minority Health Leadership at Yale University

The Commonwealth Fund Fellowship in Minority Health Leadership at Yale University is a 22-month, fully funded degreegranting program that gives healthcare practitioners the leadership skills and the deep understanding of teams, markets, and organizations necessary to tackle major inequities in the U.S. healthcare system.

Fellows attend the MBA for Executives program with a focus on healthcare while also receiving specialized training and mentoring from experts in healthcare disparities from across the university and beyond.

Fellows

The fellowship is open to health practitioners, including nurses, physicians, and physician assistants, who are committed to improving healthcare access and outcomes for minorities, socio-economically disadvantaged groups, and other vulnerable populations.

Program Structure

Fellows earn an MBA over 22 months, with classes every other weekend and four inresidence weeks, allowing them to continue in their current roles while building business acumen and gaining valuable leadership capabilities. In addition, Yale-Commonwealth Fund fellows benefit from mentoring, immersion trips, and hands-on project opportunities centered on minority health.
