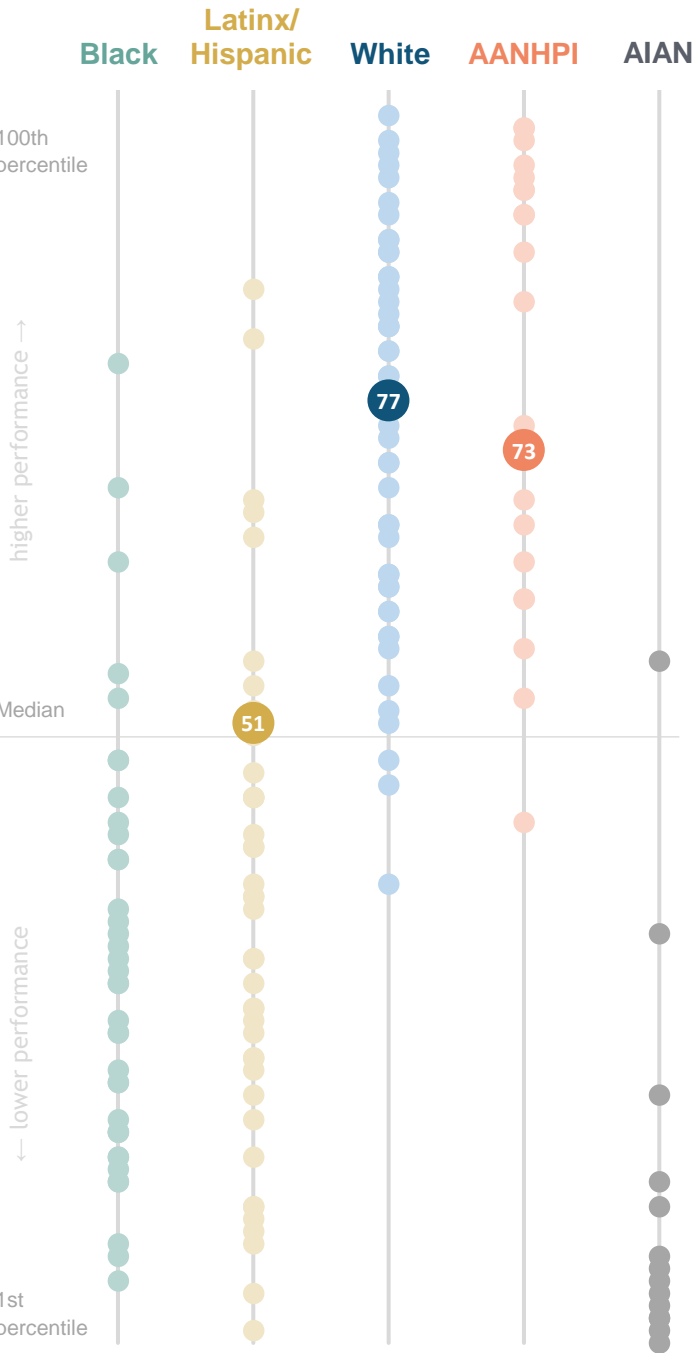


Health Equity in Oregon
