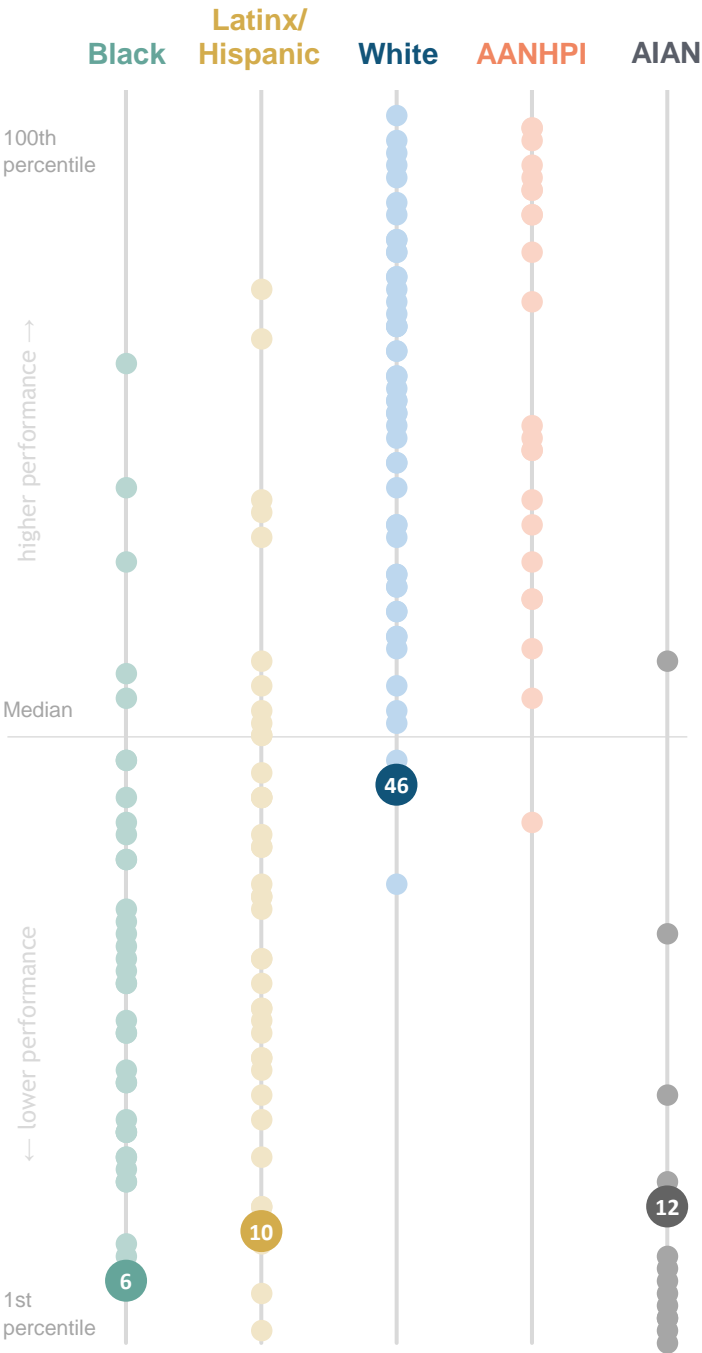


Health Equity in Oklahoma
