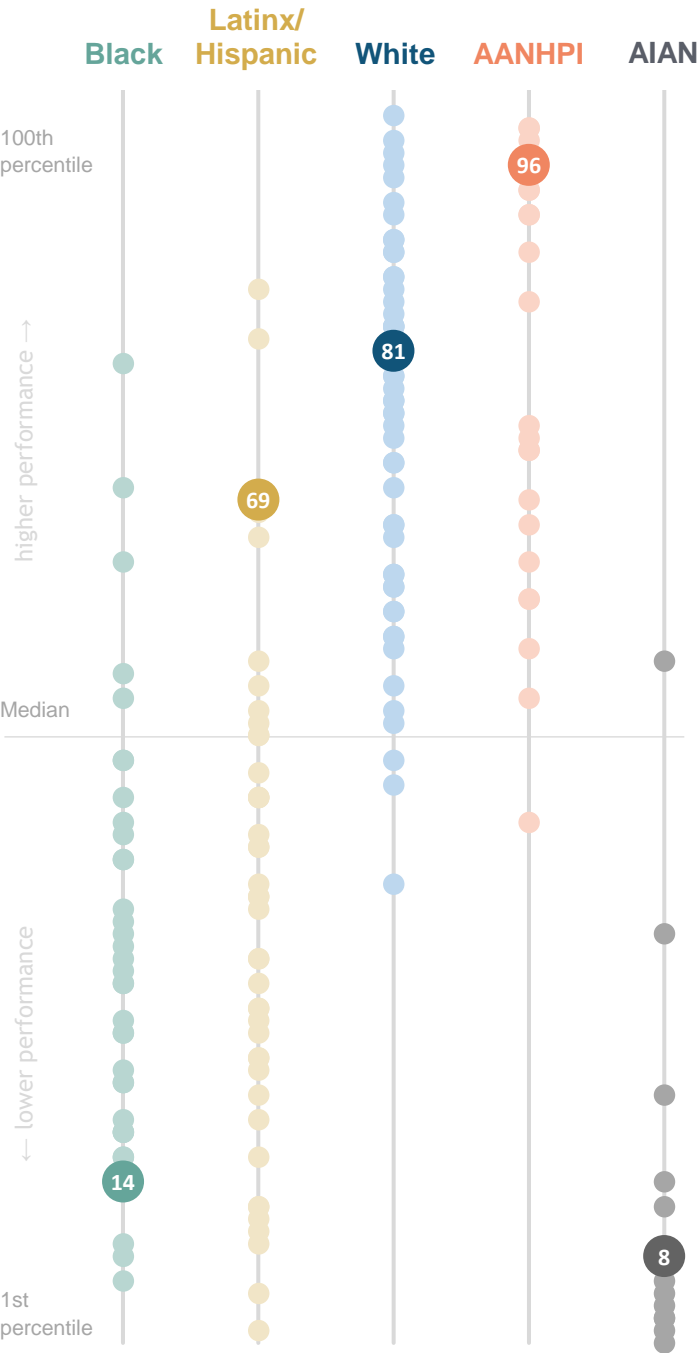


# Health Equity in Michigan
