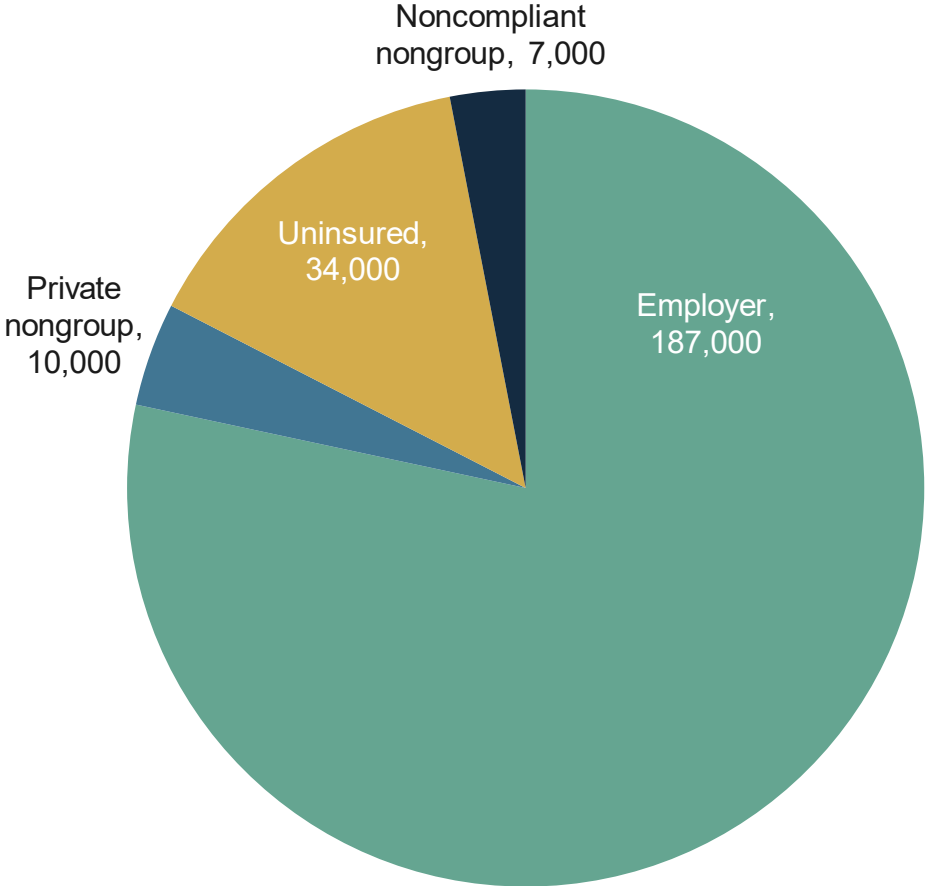


Current Law Health Coverage of the 239,000 Children Gaining Medicaid and CHIP with Mandatory 12-Month Continuous Eligibility in 2024

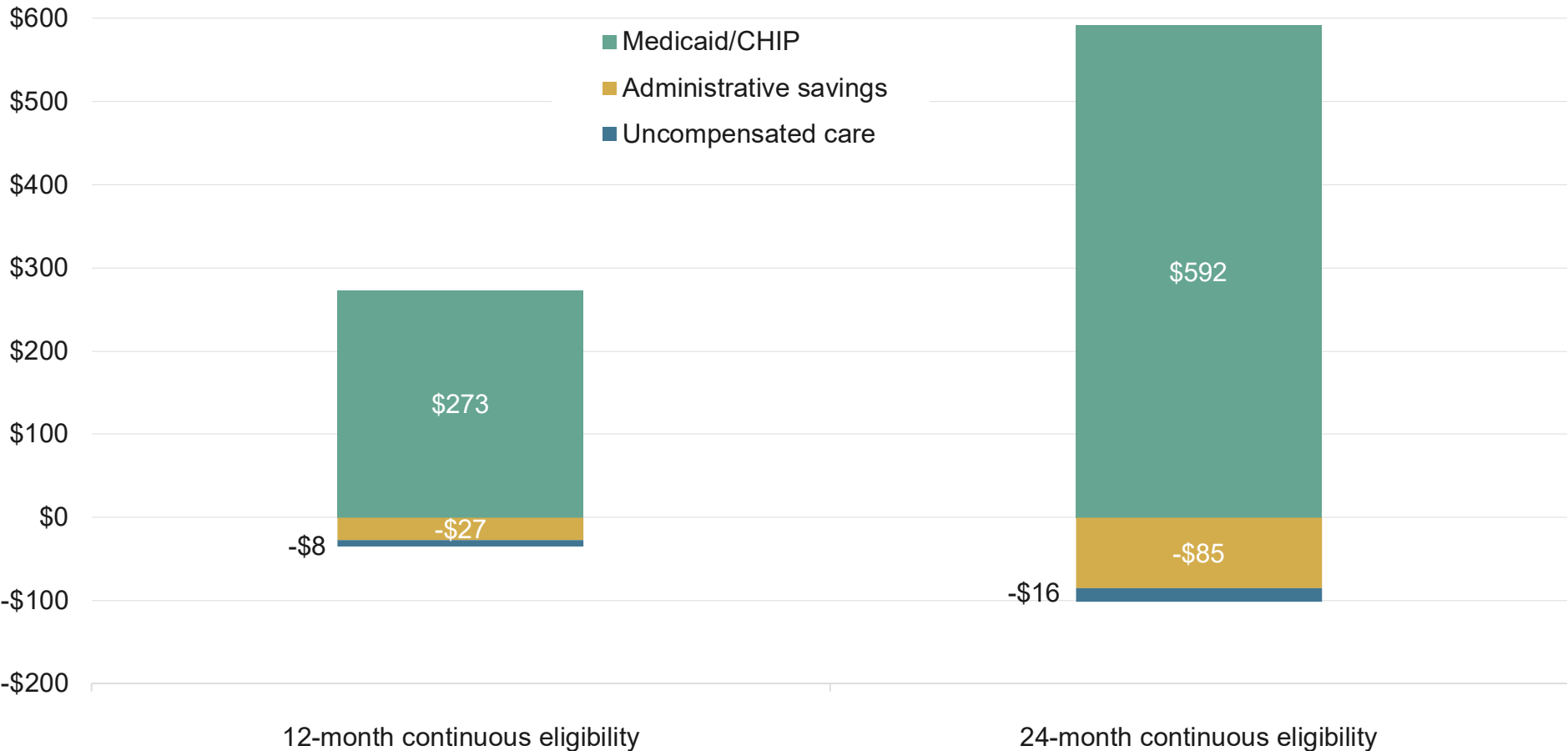

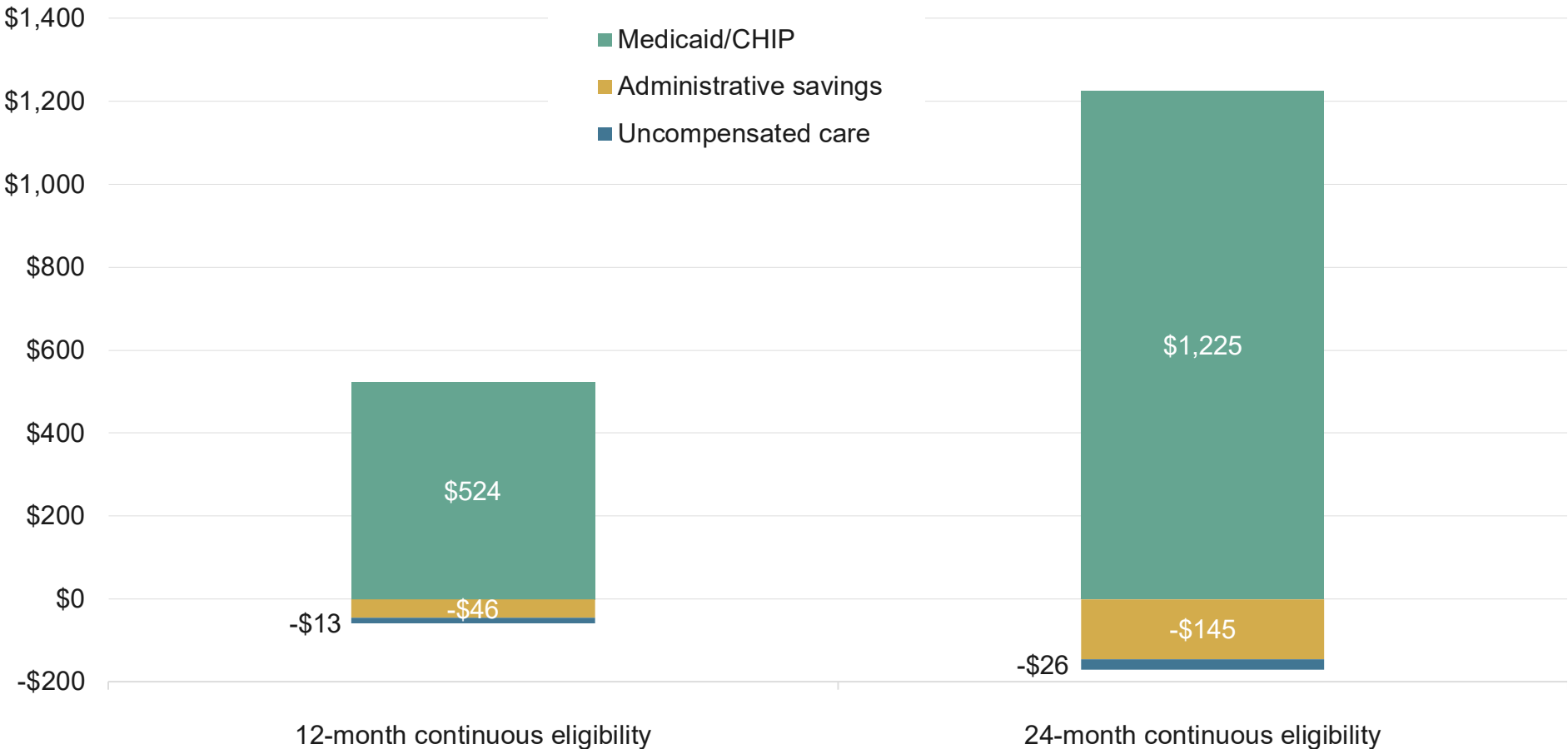
Changes in State Spending with Mandatory 12-Month Child Continuous Eligibility in 2024 (\$ millions)

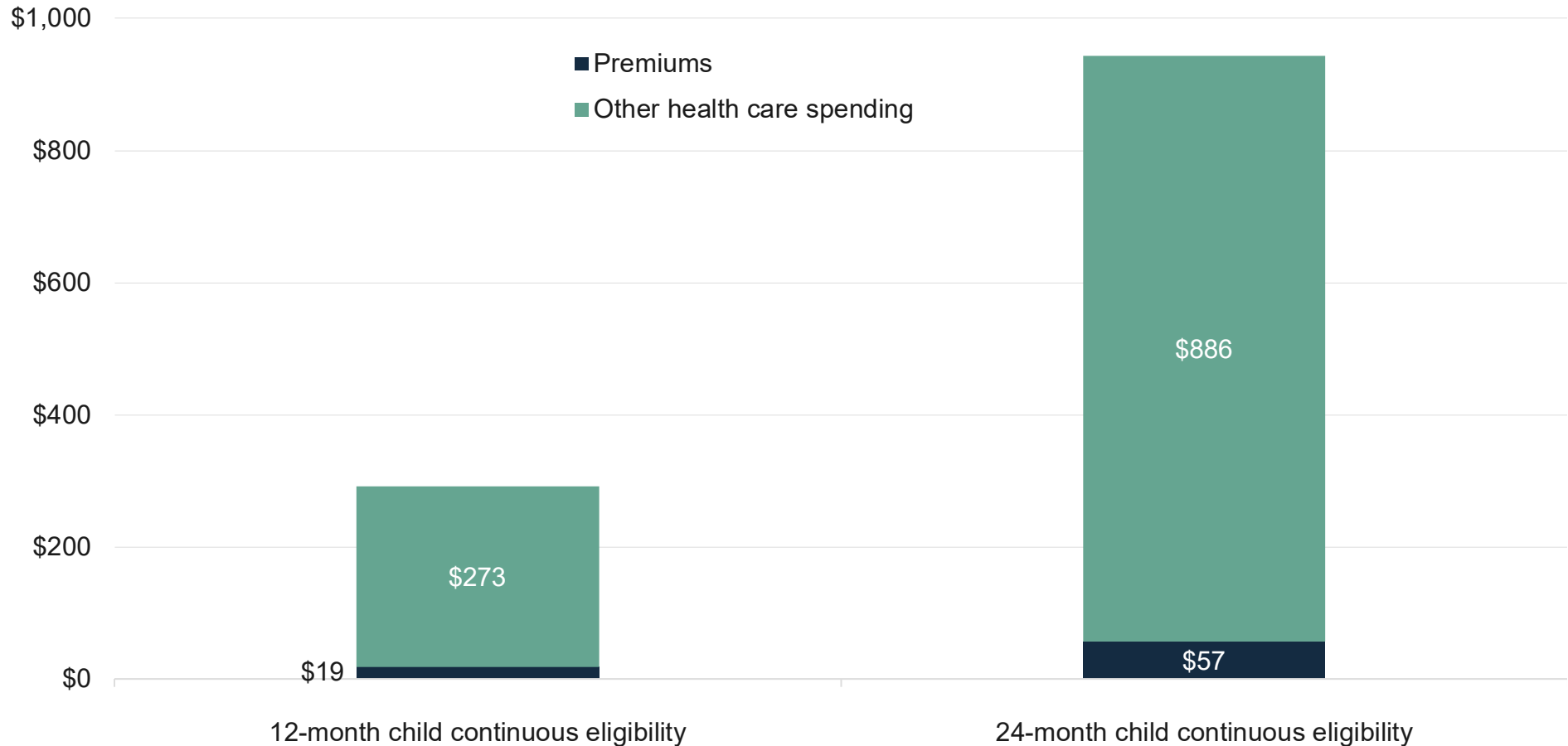
Changes in Federal Spending with Mandatory 12-Month Child Continuous Eligibility in 2024 (\$ millions)
