

- **3. Older adults without a usual source of care**: Percent of adults age 65 and older who did not have at least one person they think of as their personal health care provider. Authors' analysis of 2024 BRFSS (CDC, NCCDPHP).

- **4. Older adults without a dental visit**: Percent of adults age 65 and older who did not visit a dentist or dental clinic within the past year. Authors' analysis of 2024 BRFSS (CDC, NCCDPHP).
- 5. Beneficiaries referred for home health care who actually received it: Percent of Medicare beneficiaries with a home health referral who received home health services within seven days of hospital discharge. KNG Health analysis of CMS 2021-2022 MedPAR data, Master Beneficiary Summary File, Inpatient MA Encounter Data, Home Health Assessment Data (OASIS), Home Health Agency Standard Analytic Files, and Home Health Agency Encounter Data.
- 6. Beneficiaries who received at least one drug that should be avoided in the elderly: Percent of Medicare beneficiaries age 65 and older who received at least one drug that should be avoided in the elderly based on the Beers Criteria. Analysis excludes estrogen and insulin. - 10. Hospital 30-day mortality rate among older adults: Risk-adjusted, all-cause 30-day mortality rates among fee-for-service Medicare beneficiaries age 65 and older hospitalized with a principal diagnosis of heart attack, heart failure, pneumonia or stroke between July 2020 and June 2023. All-cause mortality is defined as death from any cause within 30 days after the index admission, regardless of whether the patient dies while still in the hospital or after discharge. - 11. - 12. The PSI-90 measure reflects hospital patient safety during delivery of care and is a composite of multiple safety-related adverse event indicators (e.g., in-hospital fall with hip fracture rate, postoperative sepsis rate, etc.). Analysis by CMS of MDS, as reported in April 2025 Nursing Home Compare (CMS).
- **15.** Long-stay nursing home residents with pressure ulcers: Percent of long-stay nursing home residents who have pressure sores (stages 1–4) on target assessment among fee-for-service Medicare beneficiaries between January 2024 and December 2024. Analysis by CMS of MDS, as reported in April 2025 Nursing Home Compare (CMS).
- **16. Older adults who received the pneumonia vaccine:** Percent of adults age 65 and older who ever received a pneumonia vaccine. Authors' analysis of 2024 BRFSS (CDC, NCCDPHP).
- **17. Older adults who received the flu vaccine**: Percent of adults age 65 and older who received a flu vaccine in the past year. Authors' analysis of 2024 BRFSS (CDC, NCCDPHP).
- **18. Older adults who received the COVID vaccine:** Percent of adults age 65 and older who received a COVID vaccine between 08/2024 and 03/2025. Analysis by CDC, retrieved from COVIDVaxView (CDC, NCIRD, accessed June 10, 2025).
- **19. Older adults who went without care because of cost:** Percent of adults age 65 and older who reported a time in the past 12 months when they needed to see a doctor but could not because of cost. Authors' analysis of 2024 BRFSS (CDC, NCCDPHP).
- **20.** Beneficiaries' average out-of-pocket spending on Part D drugs: Average dollar amount of Medicare beneficiary out-of-pocket spending on part D drugs. - 21. Total share of Part D drug costs paid by beneficiary: Average percent of total part D drug costs paid out-of-pocket by the Medicare beneficiary. - **22.** Medicare spending per beneficiary: Total Medicare fee-for-service reimbursements (in dollars) include payments for both Part A and Part B but exclude Part D (prescription drug costs) and extra CMS payments for graduate medical education and for treating low-income patients. Authors' analysis of 2023 CCW data, retrieved from the May 2025 CMS Geographic Variation Public Use File (CMS, Office of Information Products and Analytics).
- 23. Primary care spending as a share of total, age 65 and older: Primary care spending as a percent of each state's total Medicare medical spending among beneficiaries age 65 and older. We based our approach on the method used by Reid, Damberg, and Friedberg (*JAMA* 2019) that characterizes a "broad" definition for primary care provider types and a "broad" definition of included services. Under this "broad/broad" definition, we include all professional services billed by physicians, physician assistants, and nurse practitioners in family medicine, internal medicine, general practice, geriatric medicine, and obstetrics and gynecology; hospitalists are excluded.
