

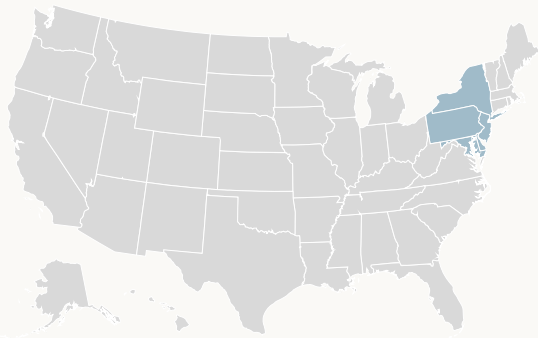

District of Columbia ranks #30 overall.

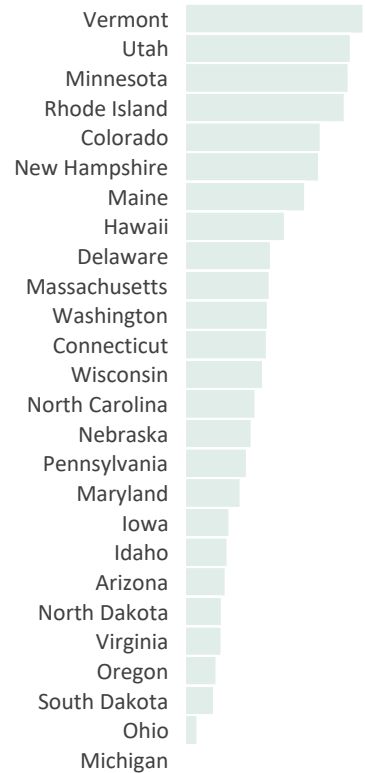

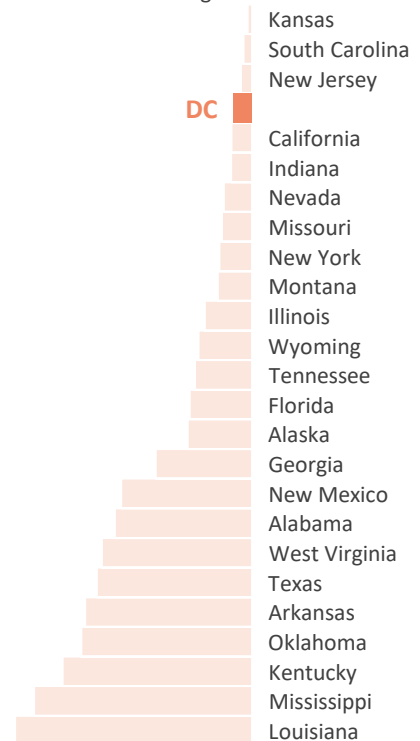
