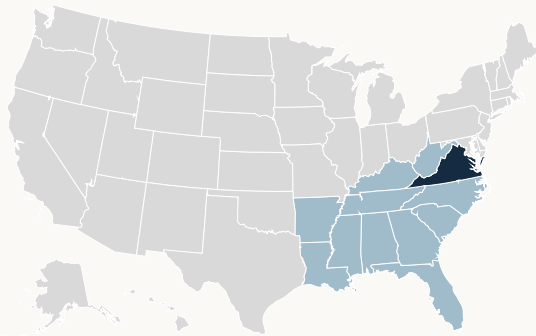

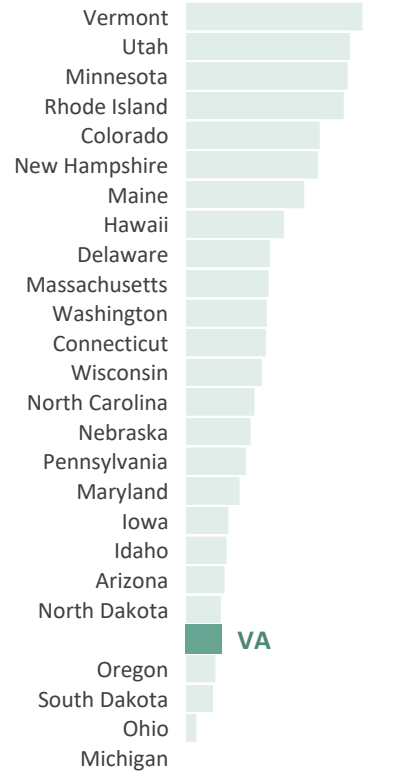

Worse-than-average overall performance

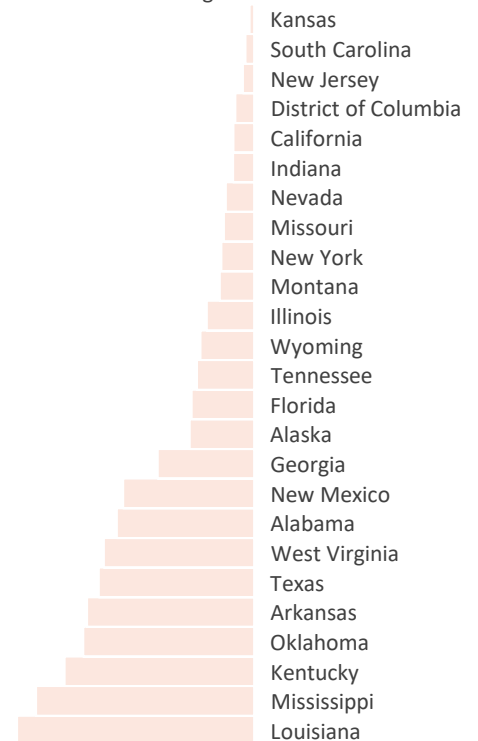
