




































Health Costs of Climate Change

The first scientific study to link health data to U.S. climate events found that for six cases between 2002 & 2009 the health care cost totaled **over \$14 billion dollars** (*Health Affairs*, 2011).

- Smog, Nationwide, 2002
- West Nile, LA 2002
- Wildfires, CA 2003
- Hurricanes, FL 2004
- Heat Wave, CA 2006
- Flooding, ND 2009


Health costs in climate change related case study areas, with costs per health effect, 2002-2009

Climate Change Related Case Study	Premature Death	Illness	Total Health Cost by Case Study
Ozone smog pollution	\$6.3 billion	\$254 million	\$6.5 billion
Heat wave	\$5.2 billion	\$179 million	\$5.3 billion
Hurricane	\$1.1 billion	\$255 million	\$1.4 billion
Wildfire	\$545 million	\$34 million	\$578 million
Mosquito- borne infectious disease	\$190 million	\$18 million	\$207 million
River flooding	\$16 million	\$5 million	\$20 million
Total cost	\$13.3 billion	\$744 million	\$14.1 billion

Paying With Our Health

Global fossil fuels subsidies: \$5.3 trillion

- 6.5% of global GDP
- More than health spending of all the world's governments

More than half of these subsidies are externalities

- Health care costs for treating victims of air pollution
- Lost income from ill health and premature deaths

Ending these subsidies would:

- Prevent 1.6 million premature deaths/year
- Significantly reduce health care costs
- Reduce CO2 emissions by 20%







Implementing Global Climate Smart Purchasing Standards

- Reduce toxicity of chemicals and materials in health products
- Reduce greenhouse gases in the supply chain
- Conserve resources (e.g. water in manufacturing)
- Leverage \$5 billion of annual UN system procurement
- Spread through Global Green and Healthy Hospital Network































Bending the Cost Curve Through Sustainability Solutions

Exhibit 2. Ten-Year Savings Estimates, by Intervention



Annual savings could exceed \$5.4 billion (£3 billion) over five years, and \$15 billion (£9 billion) over 10 years

Annual Energy Savings: \$2 billion (£1 billion) by year 5, \$6 billion (£3.5 billion) by year 10.
