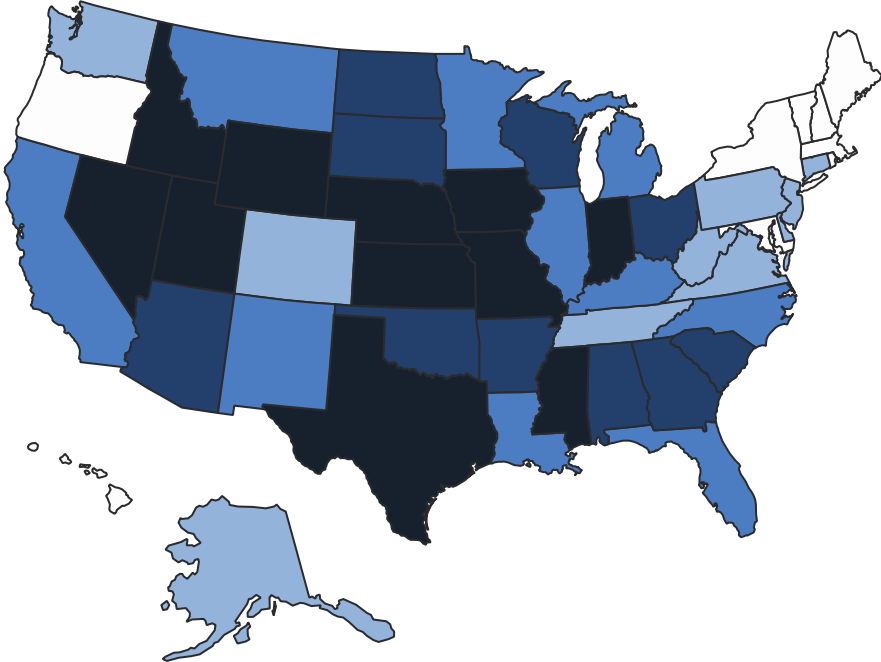
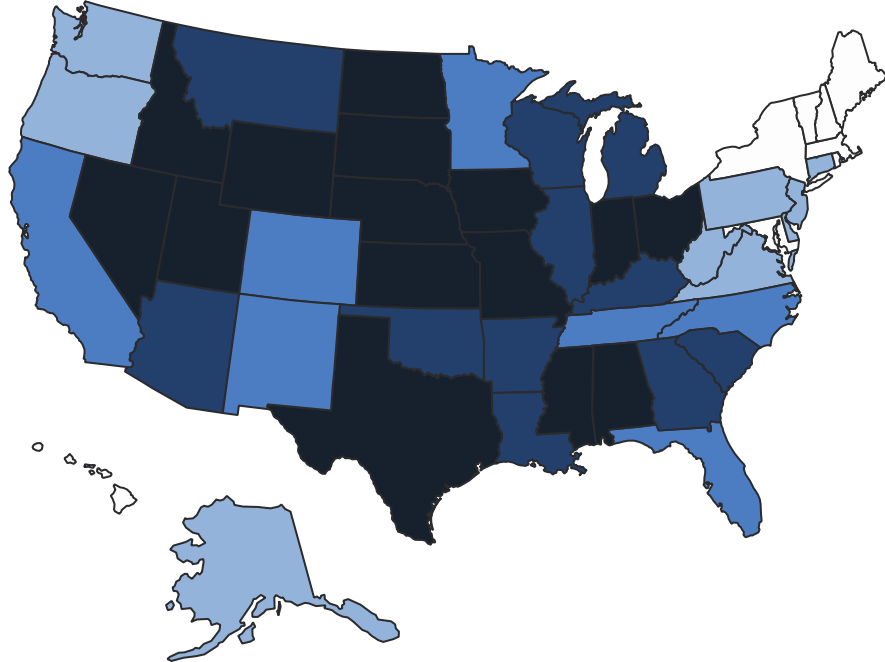


# Exhibit 1. Visits per Primary Care Physician, Pre- and Post-Affordable Care Act

Pre-ACA Visits



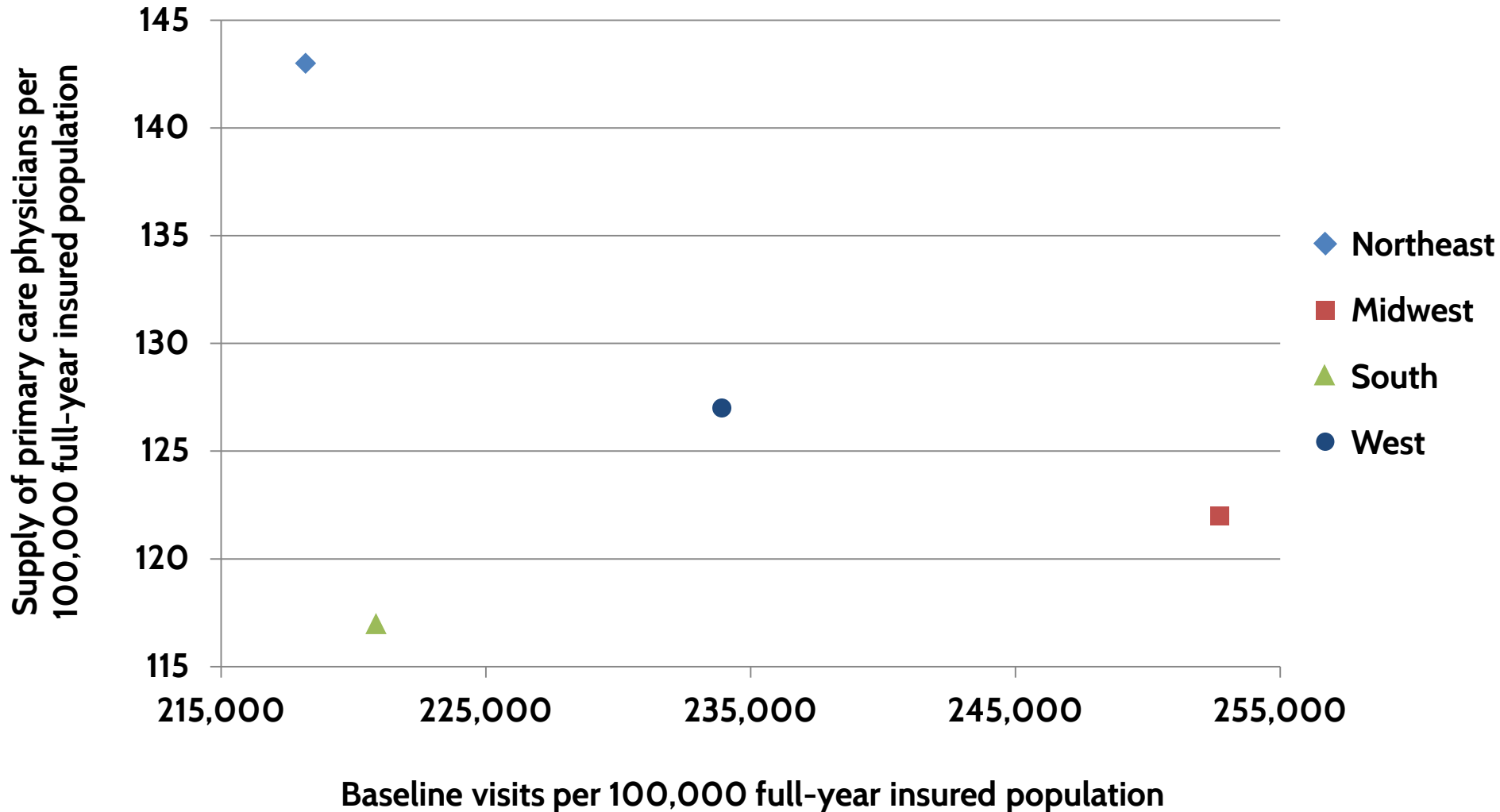
Post-ACA Visits (estimated)



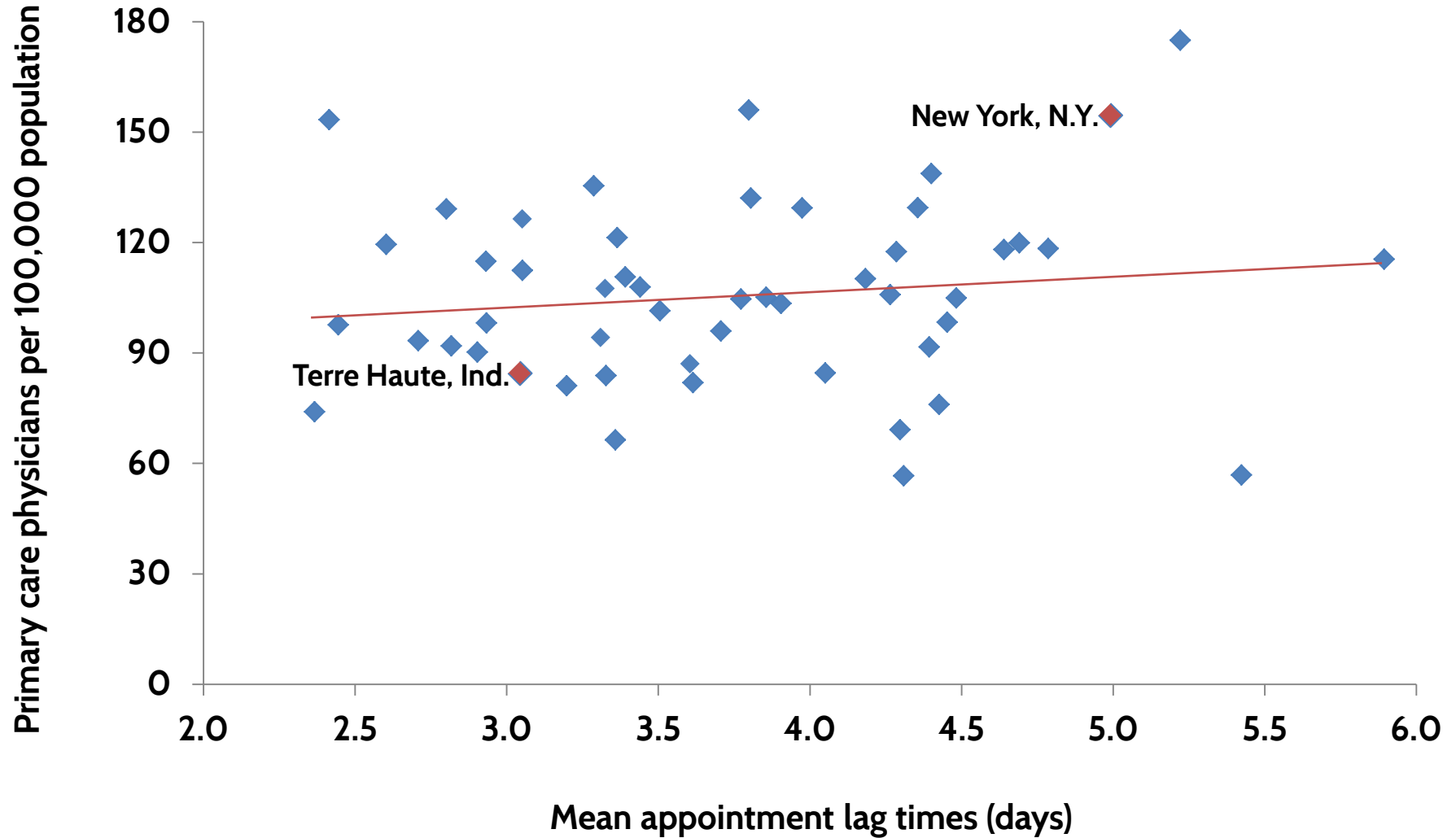
